Agenda: Curriculum Revision w.e.f July 2022

A meeting of faculty members was held in the department to revise and restructure the syllabus of M.Sc. Chemistry.

Following changes in the existing curriculum have been carried out:

(1) M.Sc. I Semester:

- MCH 104: Symmetry, Group Theory and Spectroscopy course is considered as Discipline Centric.
- Additional topic on IR spectroscopy has been incorporated in the Unit IV of the syllabus.
- Syllabus of MCH 102: Organic Chemistry has been modified as the need of NET and GATE examinations.

(2) M.Sc. II Semester:

• Discipline centric course MCH 204: Chemistry of Drugs has been renamed as Advanced Medicinal Chemistry with thorough revision of the course content.

(3) M.Sc. III Semester:

- Paper entitled "Solid State Chemistry and Nanoscience "has been shifted from M.Sc. IV to III semester and introduced as the elective paper. A topic on X Ray Diffraction studies has been included in the Unit III of the syllabus.
- Course content of Computer Applications being taught in M.Sc. II semester, has been brought to M.Sc. III semester as
- Course content of Elective paper MCH 306: Organic Synthesis has been revised with the incorporation of new topics on Name reactions in UNIT III and reagents in Unit IV of the paper. (4) M.Sc. IV Semester:

- Course content of theory paper MCH 401: Advanced Analytical Chemistry has been comprehensively revised.
- New topics on GCMS and HPLC- MS have been introduced.

- (5) Credits for all the practical courses and project/internship have been increased from 5 credits to 8 credits.
- (6) Summary of credits allocation for each semester is as follows:
 - Theory Papers: 12 Credits (Four papers of 3 Credits each one up III semester and three paper of 4 credits each in IV Semester)
 - Practicals/Project/Internship: 8 Credits
 - Comprehensive Viva Voce: 4 Credits

Total: 24 credits/semester
