International Institute of Professional Studies is one of the biggest teaching departments of Devi Ahilya University by Physical Landscape and also based on no. of Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff and Students. The size of economic activity generate in the department also results in generation of large amount of solid (day to day garbage and educational waste like dumped examination material etc.) and E-waste (Old electronic items like computer & computer peripherals)

1. Solid Waste Management:-

a) The day-to-day bio- degradable garbage produced in the department is firstly, segregated in the department as *Dry & Wet Waste*, as per the norms of Indore Municipal Corporation. The garbage collection vehicle of IMC daily visits the department to collect its segregated day-to-day waste. (**Photos of collection enclosed**)





b) The Educational waste which automatically gets created as per norms of examination after six months of examination held, is disposed of for recycling by the department as per the disposable norms and tendering process as decided by Devi Ahilya University at central level for all its teaching departments.

2. E-waste Management: -

The E-waste that is accumulated in the department is disposed of in environmental friendly manner by giving it to its manufacturers as buyback process at the time of buying new peripherals. The E-waste that is left over even after buybacks is disposed of at university levels as per the norms decided by Devi Ahilya University.
