**10:30-12:30 PM, Tuesday**

She also explained the reasons why the traditional ways of teaching like black board teaching is found to be inefficient in explaining certain practical aspect. The traditional method of teaching / learning was kind of passive learning environment where teachers act as authorities i.e., source of knowledge & the students believe on what the teacher had told. This environment also discourages the student to discuss. They were more concepts based and not experimental. Now efforts are being made to develop more active teaching / learning environment where the students construct the knowledge through their observation and the teacher acts as a guide. In such environment student change their prior predictions on the basis of new observation. The students are encouraged to learn in a collaborative manner with their peers. Students understand the concepts in better manner as they conduct experiments & observe them.

The expectation of society from the students and student from teachers is increasing and this is creating demand for reforms in the academics.
