He said that the scope of bonded labour is not only in agriculture but in other fields also. He states where bonded labour exists are Andhra, Bihar, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Haryana, and Tamil Nadu. He illustrated various reasons for it. He then discussed various articles and cases in support of this. He also explained role of state in bonded labour.
