SCIENCE**

**FROM 29.09.2015 TO 19.10.2015**

**Theme: Library and Information Resources in ICT Era**

**Date: 29.09.2015      FIRST AND SECOND SESSIONS      Time: 10.30AM to 01.30 PM**

**Inaugural Session**

The Inaugural program of Refresher Course in Library Science was held at Human Resource Development Centre, DAVV, Indore on 29th Sept. 2015 at 12.30 PM. Sri. R D Musalgaonkar, Registrar, DAVV was the Chief Guest.

**THIRD AND FOURTH SESSIONS**

**Time: 02.30 to 05.30 PM**

**Resource Person: Dr. Kishor John**

**Topics: i Web 2.0 / Library 2.0**

**ii. Libraries in the sky**

**Lecture-I:** Dr. John in his lecture discussed the various aspects of the Web 2.0, definition concept, components of Web 2.0 such as Blogs, Wikis, Content Tagging, Mashups, Streaming Media, RSS feed etc. Highlighted the important applications of Web 2.0 in libraries. In this lecture he has covered definition, and applications, services of Library 2.0.

**Lecture-II:** In this lecture, he has discussed the Cloud Computing technology its concept, definitions and brief history to development of cloud computing. He has covered SaaS (Software as a service), PaaS (Platform as a service) and IaaS (Infrastructure as a service) and giving some examples of each type of services. Also discussed public cloud, private cloud, community cloud and hybrid cloud with examples. The lecture was interactive in nature, participants has raised the queries and responded with his views.

**Topics: i Managing Electronic Subscriptions  
ii. Research Tools in ICT Era**

**Lecture-I:**Dr. Akhtar first introduced the IIM Indore Library and its best practices related to managing the subscriptions. The session was highly interactive as he took lot of questions from the participants and answered all the question satisfactorily. The following points were important in his session.

- Following a written policy related to subscription to e-resources is a must
- Negotiating skills while subscription is desirable
- Reading the purchase agreement is necessary
- Bank rate than GOC rates should be followed while subscribing journals etc.

**Lecture-II:**Dr. Akhtar in his second session (held on 30th Sept. 2015) introduced various tools being used by the Librarians and researchers in ICT era. He particularly shared inputs on how to use the reference managers like Mendley and MS Word tools. He practically showed how to create in-text and references using these tools.

**THIRD AND FOURTH SESSIONS**

**Time: 02.30 to 05.30 PM**

**Resource Person: Dr. Sandeep K.Pathak**

**Topic: KOHA: Introduction and working with different modules(2 sessions)**

Dr. Sandeep K. Pathak started the presentation with giving brief introduction and background of IISER Bhopal. Followed by this he started the presentation of Introduction automation and specific to the KOHA Open Sources Integrated Library Management Software.

Before he started the KOHA he also gave some background of Open Source Software and Free software. He also gave the differences between Open sources verses free softwares. During the explanation of this the participants also discussed many issues and he very clarified many of the issues related to this. KOHA is a Open source software, he explained in details various modules of KOHA Integrated Library Management System i.e. Administrator, Acquisition, Cataloguing, OPAC, Circulation, Serial Management and Report management etc., While presenting these modules he also gave the practical demo of all these modules and shred his wonderful experience related to the use of KOHA.

Addition to these he also gave the emphasis on how to manage the KOHA as administrator, customization, setting up of Library, user and batch import and export of metadata and how to import the bibliographical data using Z39.50 protocol from different catalogue i.e. Library of Congress, British Library and OCLC etc.,

He also explain the facilities of OPAC features of KOHA different search techniques like simple search, Advance Search, Boolean search etc., As a user how he can use his account by using the login id and Password see his reading history.

**01.10.2015**

**FIRST AND SECOND SESSIONS**

**Time: 10.30AM to 01.30 PM**

**Resource Person: Dr. Sandeep K.Pathak**

**Topic: RFID implementation in Academic Libraries(Two sessions)**

Dr. Sandeep K. Pathak started the presentation of Radio-frequency identification (RFID) with giving the importance of it's and the prerequisites to start the RFID implementation in the library. He explains in details how it works and the component of RFID technology and the standards. The tags contain electronically stored information. Some tags are powered by electromagnetic induction from magnetic fields produced near the reader. Some types collect energy from the interrogating radio waves and act as a passive transponder. Unlike a barcode, the tag does not necessarily need to be within line of sight of the reader, and may be embedded in the tracked object. Radio frequency identification (RFID) is one method for Automatic Identification and Data Capture (AIDC).

**Need of RFID:** Explained in details all the points one by one given below:

- Quick Check-out / Check-in / Renewal
- Library Security
- Faster Inventory
- Tracing out the misplaced documents
- Time saving and convenience
- Limitations of Barcode technology and EM
- Can be used to identify, trace, detect library collection

**Benefits of RFID:** Explained in details all the points one by one given below:

- Fastest, easiest, most efficient way to track, locate & manage library materials
- Efficient Book circulation management
- Automatic Check-in and Check-out
- Library inventory tracking in minutes instead of hours
- Multiple books can be read simultaneously
- Unique ID of the RFID tag prevents counterfeiting
- Automated material handling using conveyor & sorting systems

After giving the details of RFID technology, components and standards, he shared his experience of implication of RFID in IISER Bhopal and how to prepare the tender documents and what is the important point need to be take care while preparing the tender paper. Also shared the various vendors and service providers list with participants. In total the presentation was very informative and many things are discuses during the presentation.

**Resource Person: Dr.Leena Shah**

**Topics: i Green Library**

**ii. Best Practices in Library Quality Management**

Dr. Leena Shah in her lecture discussed the various aspects of Green Library, purpose of building Green libraries and steps for developing green libraries such as site selection; population; research ability location; parking; local conditions etc. Specified the main areas

of green libraries, such as water conservation, energy conservation, building materials and indoor air quality. In this lecture she has covered green library initiatives and gave some examples of green libraries. Seattle Central Library (2004), National library Singapore (2005), University of California, Green library Thailand TERI in India and Karnataka University Library did some efforts in green library development.

In the beginning of the second lecture she has suggested and shared some practical experiences in title "Best practices in library quality management". After that she covered a case study of Soul software implementation in Government Kalidas Girls College, Ujjain. The lecture was interactive in nature, participants has raised the queries and responded with her views.

**Topics: i Role of Library and Information centres in sustainable development of women scientists**

**ii. Use of E-Resources in Academic Libraries.**

Dr. Leena Shah, Librarian Government Kalidas Girls College, Ujjain ,she has discussed this topic with the sample article title "Role of libraries and information centers for sustainable development of women scientists" In second lecture she has covered " Management of E-resources in Academic libraries". In this talk she discussed some cost effective innovative ideas to planning and management of e-resources with practical examples. The lecture was interactive in nature.

**THIRD AND FOURTH SESSIONS**

**Time: 02.30PM to 05.30 PM**

**Resource Person: Prof.S.Kumar**

**Topic: Career Advancement for LIS Professionals and Research writing skills**

Prof. S. Kumar had an interactive session on selection of topics for research and writing research papers. This session was completely oriented towards audience requirements. In the beginning itself he stressed on the importance of research collaboration between Library and Information Science (LIS) professionals. He also emphasized the importance on discipline in reading regularly every day and explained how it helps a researcher. His slogan "jitnadhoge, utnadhoge" in Hindi touched a chord in each one of the participants.

Sir gave many ideas for forming research topics. According to him, germs for developing a research article can be found anywhere, even in daily newspaper articles. He illustrated this with relevant examples. He also gave many tips for developing the outline of a research paper and on writing effective literature review.

**04.10.2015**

**FIRST AND SECOND SESSIONS**

**Time: 10.30AM to 01.30 PM**

**Resource Person: Prof.S.Kumar**

**Topic: Bibliometrics (Two sessions)**

Prof. Kumar started this session with basics of Bibliometrics. This topic was new for many of the participants. He explained the concepts involved in a very simple language so that each of the participants could understand this new topic properly. He gave a historical background of the topic and also explained its applications in the library work. He mentioned that bibliometric studies helped in finding the utility of library collections and also in collection development. He also demonstrated in brief the application of Bradford's law for selection of journals in libraries and application of Lotka's law for collection development.

This session was unique due to the presentations of Kumar Sir's Ph.D. students. They demonstrated the use of online platforms for generation of questionnaires and data analysis. Actual method of citation analysis in Excel sheets was also demonstrated. **Soft Skills for Academic Professionals:**

He explained the meaning of soft skills 1) soft skills refer to skills needed in the daily interaction with other. The soft skills are the secret weapon in job hunt. He has said that soft skills use essentially people skills the non technical intangible personality specific skill that determine your strategies as a leader listener, negotiator and conflict mediator. Soft skill represent of a set of self management and self regulation strategies for managing self managing careers and managing other. He has also describe the different types of skill required in activity of a library like Acquisition section, Technical section circulation, Reference, Stock area, periodical section that is need of user Interaction.

Further important of soft skills was described; soft skills in library profession are important because Employers value soft skills. Researcher suggests that they are just as good as an indicator of job performance as traditional job qualification or hard skills for a person to be truly effective in any given situation they need to bring to it the appropriate personal skills as well as their knowledge and experience. In LIS profession two kinds of soft skills are there. one set is used to perform basic duties at work and another technical skills. A good soft skills also include the ability of people to balance the commercial need of their company with the individual need of their soft It s an important part of the success of any organization.

**Session – II: Digital preservation Issues Challenges and Strategies**

**How to preserve digital information.**

- 1). Role and nature of information
- 2). Information as a fourth resources
- 3). Fences the need for persevering for future generation

Dr. Chandran described the evolution of the information storage medium and types of it. In a digital form the web resources media has taken a lead in the storage of information comprising of text, graphic, images full text journals, database. He explained three type of web resources 1)open web 2)gate web 3)Invisible web. In a digital resources collection contents of documents are created or converted into machine readable form for online access He told about the four wheels of librarians in digital form collection of materials, organisation of the collection, preservation of the materials, dissemination of the information.

**Preservation:** preservation is an umbrella under which most librarian and archivists cluster all of the policies and option for action, including conservation treatment. It has long been the responsibility of librarian and archivists and the clerks and series who went before them to assemble and organize documentation where it is protected and used. Why preservation are in the library because records become old, limited budgets, Emergence of digital products etc. preservation is essential because of environmental factors: pollution, gas, dampness.

He explained the reason for the loss of digital information and how to preserve our documents he say that store the documents in AC room, Handle properly under the supervision of trained people keep them clean of fungus nutrients then he has explain preservation tasks. Sir gave so many examples of digital preservation.

**ii. Content Management Systems**

The topic of discussion was "Changing Dimensions of Library Services and Manpower Development" and he used Microsoft Power Point Presentation to share his views with participants of the course. The resource person started the talk with emphasis on the paradigm shift in services and operations of libraries and the necessity on part of library and information professionals to adapt to the changing information environment. He further tinted on the growing and widening information needs and expectations of users. He said that in such complex scenario, the role of library and information professionals becomes more challenging. All this requires the LIS professionals to keep themselves updated with the advancements in Information Technologies and to learn and execute the managerial skills to justify their existence in the world of digital revolution. He cited the quote of Peter Drucker that "*Good Managers are to be made*". The speaker highlighted the changes being witnessed by libraries including:

- Changes in the form of the library;
- Changes in the relationship between an institutions library and its information technology division;
- Changes in the way collections are acquired, organized, stored, and delivered; and
- Changes in the outlook of library buildings and facilities.

The speaker said that in response to the changing information environment the following innovative trends in library and information services have taken place:

- Introduction of OPAC and Web OPAC.
- Automated issues and return of documents through library software, RFID etc.
- Electronic Document Delivery services
- Development of indigenous databases
- Online Inter Library loan facility by allowing external users to access the e-books, online journals as guest users.
- Online access facilities for electronic resources
- Digital Library Services.
- Web based CAS, Conference announcement, news paper clipping services.

The speaker shared that manpower planning and development which is also called as human resource planning and development consists of putting right number of people, right kind of people at the right place, right time, doing the right things for which they are suited for the achievement of goals of the organization. Manpower development is that it is a function performed in organizations that facilitates the most effective use of employees to achieve organizational and individual goals. It is a function in organizations designed to maximize employee performance in service of their employer's strategic objectives and is primarily concerned with how people are managed within organizations, focusing on policies and systems. Dr. Chandran stressed on the need for training and development of manpower in libraries in view of the technological advancements. He said that the changing scenario of

management and leadership styles, communication media, domain/subject knowledge and other significant factors are also responsible to drive the passion of Library and Information Science (LIS) community to keep pace with the changing times.

The speaker concluded the session saying that the efficiency and effectiveness of library and information centers largely depends on the academic, professional competence and capacity building skills of the LIS professionals and their working environment and the facilities provided to them. Therefore, the proper co-ordination of human efforts and effective utilization of human and others material resources is necessary.

### **Content Management Systems**

The second topic of talk of Dr. D. Chandran was "Content Management System". The talk started after a short tea-break. He explained the concept of content management system in simple words saying that it is a process / applications used to manage content. The content may be of any type/ unit of digital information. It can be text, images, graphics, video, sound, documents, records, etc or anything that we would like to manage in an electronic format. Dr. Chandran said that a content management system is a tool that enables us to create, edit, delete and finally publish in a varying format a variety of content (such as text, graphics, video, documents, etc) while being governed by a set of rules, processes and workflows that ensure validated electronic content and coherency of the data. He discussed the following benefits of Content Management System:

- Consistent website design
- Availability of site modules and templates.
- An open source community (for support).
- Content and structure can easily be adapted.
- Content is well organized and searchable.
- Users can assign different webmasters to administer the content.

He also discussed the following Content Management Software:

He stressed on said that content and the means of managing it should be considered before any designer starts work. A content strategy that encapsulates a Content Management System, a production schedule, those responsible for producing the content and a style of content that supports your business, will dictate various aspects of the design and construction of website. Considering these things after design and construction begin may prove to be a costly mistake.

Prof. Gaddagimath discussed about the learning resources of ICT like web 2.0 tools in higher education. He specifically focused on libraries and librarian to use the technology with more enthusiasm. He said that the quality enhancement of a library is possible if we use technology. In his second session the speaker shared various 'innovative services and best practices of his university library. The session was very interesting and there were lot of initiatives that can be implemented in our library.

He discussed about how the technology has changed the libraries. He gave the examples of some reputed libraries in India and abroad. He discussed how the portals of the libraries help attract the user community to the library. In his talk the speaker also shared his experiences about handling the technology with the help of the technical team. He said that the use of open source software and getting the automation work from the third party has saved time, energy and money too.

In his second session the speaker shared various 'innovative services and best practices of his university library. He particularly shared the tips to convince the authorities in getting the needed infrastructure for the library. He said the thinking, negotiating skill and proactive initiatives are essential while fund raising for the library. He said with the help of his public relations he could raise at least four crore rupees from the corporate firm, local government representatives, funding agencies etc. The funding helped him establish a computer lab of one hundred computers with internet connection.

He interacted with the participants and answered the queries related to establishing the technical infrastructure and building the automated library system with the help of proper planning and funding. Both the sessions were very interesting as there lot of initiatives that can be implemented in our library.

In his session on research paper writing, editing and critiquing, he shared lot tips to be a good writer as well as an editor. He said that a use of dictionary can help in planning for user orientation programs. The librarians can devise small training programs on editing skills. He shared the importance of the references and following the citation standards for the accuracy in in-text citation and references.

Later in his second session, he discussed about the importance of having positive attitude and striving hard for excellence for quality productivity and services in the libraries. He said the positive attitude comes from the right thinking, having good relation with the right people, reading etc. These help have the positive attitude.

Dr. S. S. Kushwah started his talk with discussion on open source software for developing institutional repositories. The speaker demonstrated the installation of Dspace using live CD-ROM. He shared that Drupal is actually much more than open source content management system. Drupal is written in PHP, a Web application scripting language, written in C and is easy to learn. Like most web applications Drupal needs to store data in a database (MySQL). The speaker discussed Drupal file system structure including /misc, /modules, /profiles, /scripts, /sites, /themes, etc. He emphasized on how to install Drupal. He explained the Module as the modular piece of code that extends Drupal and provide additional functionality without altering the Drupal core. He explained the different modules of the software including aggregator, block, blog, blogapi, book, color, comment, contact, dblog, filter, forum, help, locale, menu, node, openid, path, php, ping, poll, profile, search, statistics, syslog, system, taxonomy, throttle, tracker, translation, trigger, update, upload and user. The speaker answer the queries of participants.

The second part of session 2 started at scheduled time, after a tea break of 10 minutes. After giving more details about Dspace, Dr. Kushwah gave a demonstration on customization of Online Public Access Catalogue of KOHA. He showed how to upload logo of institution on OPAC, how to modify the background and how to use RSS feeds. He also shared that the

OPAC of library can be used as a web page to provide various details of library. The speaker discussed that the shelfari.com can be integrated with KOHA to serve as virtual shelf. Dr. Kushwah discussed various administrative feature of OPAC and satisfied the queries of the participants. At the end of the session Dr. Ramnivas Sharma gave vote of thanks to the resource person.
